MEMBER PROFILE GARRY CHRONICAN


For nigh on a decade, the Barbarians have been closely aliqued, financially as well as spiritually, with schools rugby.

Most often the main point of contact with the NZ Schools Rugby Council has been chairman Garry Chronican of Dunedin, now a proud member of the club as of last year.

The 60-year-old is steeped in the game, a midfielder for the Dunedin club, Otago Colts and Otago B. From 1986-95 he coached the Kaikorai Valley High School First XV, winning the Under 18 comp in 1987. In the same period he coached or managed various Otago Schools and U18 teams.

His contact with the Barbarians has proven mutually beneficial for both parties.

In the meantime, other than being up to his eyeballs in schools rugby work, and onto his third year on the Otago Rugby Union board, Chronican can be found at Forsyth Barr Stadium supporting either the Highlanders or the Otago Razorbacks, for whom he has high hopes under the guidance of new coach Ben Herring in the Mitre 10 Cup.

After many years teaching and coaching sport at Kaikorai Valley High School, he has a new role as academic manager of the University of Otago Foundation Studies programme. Happily, his office is adjacent to the stadium.

NZ BARBARIANS AREA SCHOOLS



This unheralded but vital national team is in action again on September 15 against the Manawatu Under 16s in Palmerston North.

Drawn from rural and often far-flung schools who may not even have a First XV, this side gives talented young players on an annual basis an opportunity to shine with their peers and wear the Barbarians jersey. In 2017 the side played two games in Canterbury Country after previously having perennial fixtures against the Waikato Harlequins Under 18s.

Managed by Barbarian member Mike Smith, with Justin Marsh and Steve Beck as the coaches, the squad, chosen after the July NZ Area Schools sports tournament in Christchurch, includes several who were in the 2016 and '17 teams.

Jim Lonergan: long-time schools coach/manager/ administrator; 1984-2012 master in charge of rugby at Macleans College; life member of Auckland Schools union; NZ Schools council member; finalist for Volunteer of the year at 2012 Steinlager Rugby Awards; 2016-18 chief executive of College Sport in Auckland

Huriana Manuel: former Blacks Ferns centre (25 tests from 2005-14), including two RWC titles; Blacks Ferns Sevens captain, 2013 RWC 7s winner; 2016 Rio Olympics silver medallist

Apollo Perelini: former Manu Samoa loose forward (9 tests from 1991-93); played for North Harbour, Sale Sharks; also played for St Helens and Samoa in league; coached in UK and Dubai; currently coaches UAE 7s and 15s teams and is UAE high performance manager

Ric Salizzo: played for De La Salle First XV; TVNZ rugby reporter in 1980s; produced ground-breaking docos of 1989-90 All Blacks tours; first All Blacks media liaison officer 1992-95; produced Sports Café and Crowd Goes Wild; former Blues board member

Regina Sheck: former Black Ferns prop (25 tests from 1994-04), including two RWC titles; played for Auckland and Waikato; coached in Waikato
