Deaths Of Members

Ness Toki (1949-2016)

Ness Toki was a small but tigerish openside flanker whose career high point was probably his display for the New Zealand Maori against the 1971 Lions at Eden Park.

On that occasion, the first-class rookie played above himself, getting in Barry John's face and harassing the great No 10. The Maori lost, but Toki was noticed. He tackled low and was always a clean player, but did it with a smile, hence his nickname 'The Smiling Assassin.'

He went on to play 23 first-class games until 1978, including nine games for Auckland out of the College Rifles and Suburbs clubs, the latter with whom he featured prominently in their first Gallaher Shield triumph in 1977. Toki formed part of a loose trio that included the outstanding Glenn Rich.

His playing days effectively ended in Italy in the early 1980s at the Casale club, second home for several Suburbs players, when he was the victim of foul play.

Toki was soon giving back to the game via coaching. He took the MAGS First XV, with some success, in the late 1980s, and was the Auckland union's coaching co-ordinator to various rep teams, including this scribe's 1991 Auckland Schools team.

Toki's brother Leon also appeared for New Zealand Maori and Auckland.

Nessie Toki died in December near family in Kaikohe, having shifted from west Auckland due to a degenerative illness.



MEMBER PROFILE MELISSA RUSCOE



One of a clutch of Black Ferns who are now Barbarian members, Melissa Ruscoe has a long list of achievements, highlighted by the rare feat of captaining her country in two different sports.

The 40-year-old had 23 caps for the Football Ferns before switching codes at the age of 24, where she proceeded to master the intricacies of loose forward play, win two Rugby World Cups, the 2005 NZRU women's player of the year and the MNZM honour in 2011 for services to rugby.

Ruscoe says her nomination to join the Barbarians last year was an unexpected honour.

"I had to read the letter a couple of times. I'd heard of the NZ Barbarians, of course, and knew some women were members, but didn't think about it myself until the letter came through, which was exciting. You don't think about those kinds of accolades," says Ruscoe, a Christchurch teacher at Hillmorton High School.

She took the chance to catch up with some of her old Black Ferns teammates in the October 22 Bledisloe at the clubrooms, and was suitably impressed with our home base.

Ruscoe played 22 tests for the Black Ferns out of Canterbury, mainly as a skilled, accurate blindside. She had already acquired the nickname 'Fraggle' from her football days, but it is very much a term of endearment rather than any lack of respect for this leader.

"You always have that connection when you see the (rugby) girls again. You might not see them a lot, but



it's like it is yesterday. Everyone still keeps in touch via Facebook," she says.

Whilst a long-time Canterbury resident, she hails from Taranaki, and the amber and blacks still command her support these days.

"You always support where you come from, so it's black and yellow, and the Chiefs, because I went to uni there. I'm not a one-eyed Cantabrian," Ruscoe quips.

The Blacks Ferns have a royal show of lifting their fifth World Cup this August in Ireland, and first since Ruscoe led them to glory in 2010.

"I think the girls will definitely be back up there. We didn't see ourselves as world champs when we entered the World Cup. You have to earn that right. I'm sure the girls will do us proud and they've got some exciting talent."



November 30 saw the Barbarians club hold its 80th AGM at the Eden Park clubrooms.

Around 40 members, just under 10 percent of the full membership, heard from President **Ron Williams** and club captain **Mark Moore** on the club's many activities in 2016. Barbarian **Mike Donovan**, who is chairman of Auckland Rugby, gave an update on the union's 2016 season, making the salient point that over 100 players who came through the Auckland schools or academy systems, are dotted around the country. That is a sure sign of the professional times.

There was little change in the election of officers, with two notable additions.

Immediate past President **Bryan 'Beegee' Williams** was elected patron to replace the late **Bob Sorenson**, who died in 2016. Beegee needs little introduction, but he did become a Barbarian in the 1970s, before the age of 30, a rare occurrence. He has always espoused the Barbarian ideals and is a true man of rugby as indeed are many men (and women) in the club. In 2003 he coached the NZ Barbarians in their landmark clash with England at Twickenham, which helped set up the club financially. Beegee may be 66 now, but he is still active at his beloved Ponsonby club and serves on the Barbarians committee.

There is a new committee member, **Kevin Senio**, who only joined the club last year. The 38-year-old is All Black No 1058. The former halfback played one test in 2005,

and also appeared for the Junior All Blacks, New Zealand Sevens, Crusaders, Chiefs, Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Counties Manukau and Canterbury. His active playing days only ended in 2015 after stints with French clubs Castres and Clermont. He now does important work for the NZ Rugby Players' Association in getting around schools explaining the pros and cons of professional rugby.

Last but not least, the sterling long-term work of **Dean Paddy**, who steps down as house manager after many years, was acknowledged. His successor as house manager is **Michael Speight**, while **Trina Seits** steps into the bar manager's role.
