

The All Blacks will face Manu Samoa for the first time at this venue since the rousing encounter of 1993. The match will be the final hitout for the All Blacks ahead of the Lions series, while Samoa have a big test against Wales a week later in Apia and then the key Pacific Nations Cup, which doubles as RWC qualifying.

There is plenty being organised in the lead-up to the clash, with a parade in Mangere on June 10 leading to Fale Samoa and a dinner that night.

The curtainraiser will see Tonga take on Wales from 5.30pm, so there should be plenty of fireworks in that one.

The good news is that Barbarians box ticket holders will have access to their seats at no extra cost for what should be a good night ahead of the even bigger nights of June 24 and July 8 Lions tests No 1 and 3.

1987 NZ BARBARIANS TO UK

Thirty years ago, the NZ Barbarians kicked off their first tour of the UK and Ireland.

It was the centrepiece of the club's 50th jubilee celebrations, but it also served as a prime chance for the All Blacks selectors to send away some of their candidates for the looming inaugural Rugby World Cup in a competitive, yet relaxed, rugby setting.

Five games were played over an intense fortnight, all won in fine style, and with just the bare minimum squad of 22, though Wayne Smith was drafted in from Italy as a replacement for one game. The Barbarians' ethos of expansive rugby was adhered to, and the social element was fully encouraged.


