It was a great night supported by the large Cormack family including young grandchildren and a lot of Mike's friends

and fellow Barbarians. Mike's input into the successful relocation into the ASB Stand has been invaluable for the club. His perseverance, great negotiating skills and sharp legal mind ensured we now have a lounge and corporate suites that you would do well to better in any rugby stadium in the world.

Despite his illness, Mike gave a brilliant acceptance speech and was very honoured to be recognised in the club. Less than three days later came the sad news that Mike had passed away. All club members will mourn his passing.

Sir Fred Allen

Mike's first Auckland coach, the great Sir Fred Allen, passed away just days beforehand, on April 28.

The funeral was held at the ASB Lounge and the Barbarians club hosted the family and close friends for coffee before the funeral. Legendary stories about Sir Fred were movingly told by three of our rugby knights, Sir Wilson Whineray, Sir Colin Meads and Sir Brian Lochore.

Sir Fred was very well respected for his knowledge and passion for rugby as a player, coach and later mentor. Barbarians, Sir Fred's family and rugby greats shared a drink or two at the club afterwards.

The passing of Mike and Sir Fred follow the earlier deaths of two great rugby men and members of this club - 'Tiny' White and Jock Hobbs.

Barbarians middleweight team



THE MIKE CORMACK SUITE

As mentioned by President Mike Mills, the evening of Tuesday May 8 saw the unveiling and dedication of the Mike Cormack Suite, which takes in the Barbarians box which overlooks Eden Park. The club boxes were key planks of Mike's desire for the Barbarians clubrooms to have an area overlooking the park, and he fought long and hard to make this vision a reality. The end product speaks for itself and is a fitting tribute to Mike, who was President of the Barbarians from 2006-07, and was integral in the transition from 'The House that Jack Built' to where the

club is now situated.

There was a large turnout to see Mike, testament to the wide respect with which he is held and the friendships he has made in the game. Sadly, it was to be his last public outing as he passed away just three days later after his long illness.

The club remembered him again this week at his funeral and subsequent 'wake' in the clubhouse.

*NB. There will be a 'Sleepy's Corner' dedication evening, to be announced in due course. DJ 'Sleepy' Cameron has generously donated many books from his extensive library and these will be housed in the north-east corner of the clubrooms, where some of the club books are already housed.

DEATHS OF MEMBERS

'Tiny' White (1925-2012)

One of three Poverty Bay Barbarians, Richard 'Tiny' White was a true giant of rugby. A 23-test All Blacks lock forward whose career at the top was ended by an act of foul play by a Springbok in 1956, White had a genuine love of the game and his High School Old Boys club in Gisborne. He was always proud to present the Tiny White Medal for the outstanding player on the opening day of every Poverty Bay club rugby season. From 1977-83 he was mayor of Gisborne.

White's sons Chris (Olympic bronze rowing medallist) and David (Canterbury and Wairarapa Bush lock) both excelled in their sport.

'Jock' Hobbs (1960-2012)

The passing of Jock Hobbs in March reverberated around the rugby world.

He was very ill from leukaemia, which forced him from his role as NZRU chairman, but his time as a rugby administrator, former All Blacks captain, and coach of the New Zealand Universities will never be forgotten.

Hobbs played a central and vital role in bringing the All Blacks back to the fold when rugby went pro in 1995 and the WRC was threatening to buy many of the top players, but he was also integral to the awarding of the 2011 Rugby World Cup hosting rights to New Zealand, and the introduction of the popular All Blacks capping evenings, which ran from 2009-11.

Hobbs' brother-in-law is Barbarian and current Wallaby coach Robbie Deans. Concussion ended Hobbs' career before its time and now cancer has claimed a decent bloke and a sterling rugby man well before his time.

Sir Fred Allen (1920-2012)

Sir Fred Allen was one of six NZ rugby (and Barbarians) knights and his career needs little in the way of extensive review, suffice to say he was a revolutionary coach of Auckland (1957-63) who then forged an unbeaten record at the helm of the All Blacks (1966-68).

One of only three who have captained and coached the All Blacks (along with Sir Brian Lochore and John Mitchell), Allen was a proud Barbarian and a regular visitor to Eden Park. He was still an astute observer of the game late into his long life. The clubrooms held a 'wake' for Allen after his funeral – which brought close to 800 mourners – at the ground. *Check out www.barbarianrugby.co.nz for a *Rugby News* tribute to Sir Fred Allen.



Mike Cormack (1938-2012)

A life member of both of the Barbarians and Auckland University clubs, Cormack played 45 games for Auckland from 1960-66 as a fearless, dependable fullback. He is perhaps remembered best in his playing days for converting Waka Nathan's famous try in the 1960 Ranfurly Shield defence at Eden Park against Canterbury to ensure Auckland retained the Log o' Wood. In 1966 he was part of the Gallaher Shield-winning University side, and he went on to coach the Varsity premiers in the late 1970s, also serving as president in 1987-88.

A lawyer by profession, Cormack's negotiating skills were central to the successful transition into the current clubhouse we enjoy today, and it is entirely fitting that the boxes looking out onto Eden Park have been named the Mike Cormack Suite.

75TH YEAR JUBILEE

Many of you will recall with fondness the 70th birthday celebrations at Eden Park for the Barbarians club. That was back in 2007, marking three-score and 10 years since the New Zealand chapter of this famous club was founded by messrs Ron Bush and Hugh McLean.

The 75-year milestone has rolled around swiftly, and the Barbarians will be marking the occasion on Friday September 21 with a dinner and suitable celebration at the ground. Past president Phil Lindesay is chairing the organising committee. Barbarian and former Tongan international Willie Los'e will MC the event with former Wallaby midfielder Anthony Herbert confirmed as one of the guest speakers.

NZ BARBARIANS SCHOOLS

Later in the year we will see a new Barbarians side do battle on the rugby field.

The New Zealand Barbarians Schools team will play two matches, in the famous scarlet strip, against Australian Schools (in Hamilton) and Samoa Schools (in Auckland). This side will represent those top schoolboys not in the New Zealand Schools squad, but will form a meaningful pathway into that top team for 2013. The coach is former Canterbury rep Mark Vincent, who is the coach of the First XV at John Mills' alma mater St Bede's College.

The Barbarians will supply a technical advisor and assistant manager to the side. The club will continue its backing of the national top four schools competition, which will be held a few weeks before the international matches.

GOLF V EAGLES

The annual tournament against the Eagles, this time at the Manukau Golf Club in April, proved to be another tightly contested clash, though on this occasion the Eagles prevailed, to regain the trophy.

Organiser Bryan Craies is apparently already plotting his revenge for 2013!

MIDDLEWEIGHTS ON TOUR

The NZ Barbarians' support of middleweight (under 85kg) rugby continues to be as strong as ever.

This burgeoning grade has really taken off in the wider Auckland region and the Barbarians rep side out of this region has represented the club with pride and honour in the last few seasons. The latest match was against the Wellington Centurions last month in the capital. The Barbarians won the clash 21-7 (see image below) with tries to Gerrard MacInnes and Joel Murphy, Scott Thomson adding the extras.

It was a hit and run trip, with the side, plus senior Barbarians management, in Wellington for less than 24 hours. As ever,

former Auckland coach Bryan Craies was the selection convenor, with former All Blacks wing Gary Cunningham and Wayne Underhay as coaches and Deano Allnutt as manager. Initial feedback suggests the players take great pride in wearing the scarlet jersey and digging in as representatives of the club.

The next big date for the Barbarians middleweight programme will be the Auckland tournament in September, which will feature regional rep sides. In the meantime, the clubs will all play in their respective Under 85kg competitions.

*A Barbarians selection lost 0-21 to a strong Japanese touring side from Kanto Districts at Onewa Domain in April. The Barbarians included a sprinkling of ITM Cup and club players from around the Auckland region.
